

## ATTIRE

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Students are expected to dress in a way that respects the school's values and academic purposes. They are expected to come to school wearing clothing that is neat, clean, in good repair, and appropriate. Whether on campus or representing Poly at school-related events, students are expected to wear clothing that demonstrates respect for themselves, the school, and the people around them.

Students may:

- Wear shorts, skirts, or clothing of mid-thigh length or longer.
- Wear leggings or tights when paired with clothing of at least mid-thigh length.
- Not wear sweatpants or joggers other than for athletic activities.
- Not wear flip flops.
- Not wear clothing exposing torsos or undergarments.
- Not cover their heads.

Students whose religions require specific attire are exempted from the relevant guidelines listed above.

Students may wear clothing, within the guidelines, to express themselves as individuals but which does not objectify anyone or their identities, glorify violence, espouse hatred, or reflect drug, tobacco, or alcohol use.

On special occasions, students are expected to dress in accordance with the formality of a school event. On these dress-up days, students are required to choose from among the following: dresses or skirts (mid-thigh or longer), slacks, non-denim pants, blouses, dress shirts with a tie or sweater, blazers, and turtleneck sweaters.
